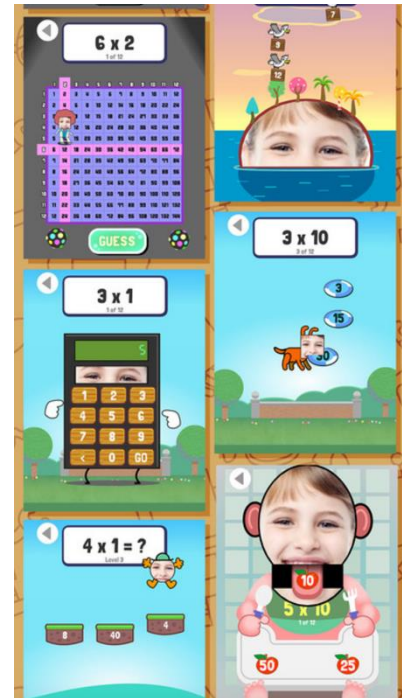


Some Apps for Learning Times Tables and Other Basic Facts

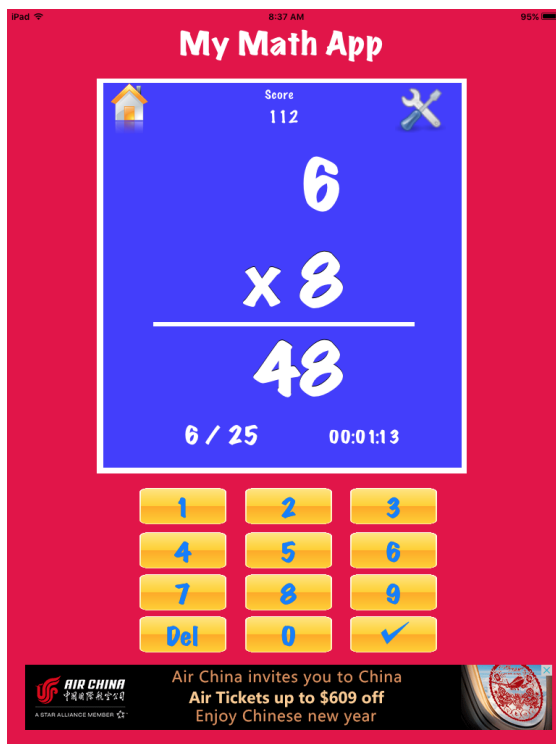

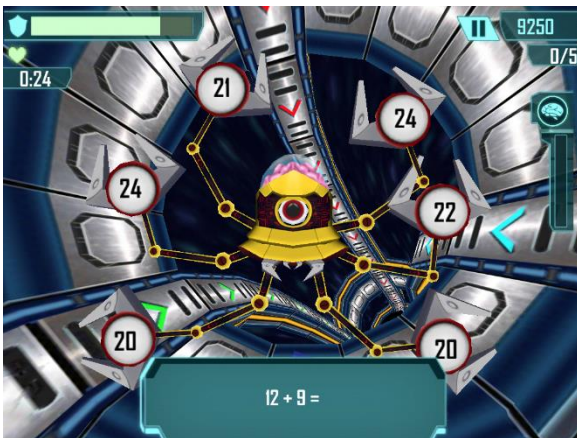
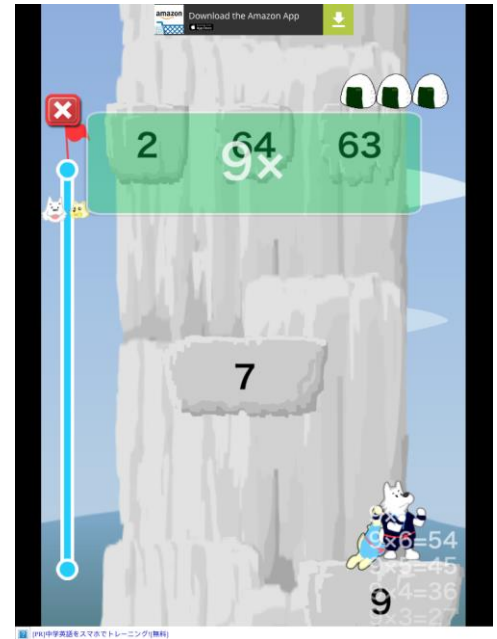
